### RAPIDS SELECT NCAA GOALS PER GAME LEADER ANDREW MITTENDORF WITH FIRST-ROUND PICK IN COLLEGE DRAFT

#### *NEPHEW OF FORMER DENVER BRONCOS SAFETY RANDY POLTL CHOSEN IN SECOND ROUND*

DENVER (Sunday, February 7, 1999) – The Colorado Rapids bolstered their attack Sunday when they selected forward Andrew Mittendorf out of Lehigh with their first pick (#8 overall) in the 1999 Major League Soccer College Entry Draft in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. Mittendorf led the NCAA in goals per game (1.33), scoring 24 times in only 18 outings in his senior campaign at Lehigh.

With their second-round choice, the Rapids then drafted midfielder Tom Poltl out of UCLA. Poltl is the nephew of former Denver Broncos defensive back Randy Poltl. The Rapids then took defender Bobby Meyer out of Dartmouth in the third and final round.

Colorado then took four players in the three-round 1999 MLS Supplemental Draft. The Rapids added midfielders Kevin Anderson and Darren Sawatzky in the first round, before selecting GK David Winner and defender Tim Martin in the second and third rounds, respectively.

Mittendorf, a 6-0, 170 lb. striker, was a two-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year. The Southbury, Connecticut, native amassed an impressive 43 goals and 20 assists in 84 games over his four-year career, despite playing his freshman and sophomore seasons as a midfielder.

Poltl was a four-year starter at midfield for the UCLA Bruins, collecting 13 goals and 16 assists over his 82 games. The 5-6, 145 lb. midfielder is the nephew of Randy Poltl, a former free safety with the Denver Broncos (1975-1977) and the Minnesota Vikings.

Meyer is a 6-0, 180 lb. defender from Dartmouth. Originally from Long Island, N.Y., he will compete for a spot in the Rapids' already-crowded back line.

Anderson spent 1998 with the Minnesota Thunder, the 1998 runners-up to the A-League championship. The midfielder scored 11 goals and added 4 assists over 34 games as the Thunder lost in the final to the Rochester Rhinos.

Sawatzky, a flank midfielder known for his torrid pace, has been in MLS since 1996, playing last season with the Dallas Burn after spending the first two years with the New England Revolution.

Winner is a goalkeeper who was most recently with the Miami Fusion, before that spending more than two seasons with the Columbus Crew.

Martin has spent the past three seasons with the San Jose Clash, playing 83 games with San Jose before being released following the 1998 season.

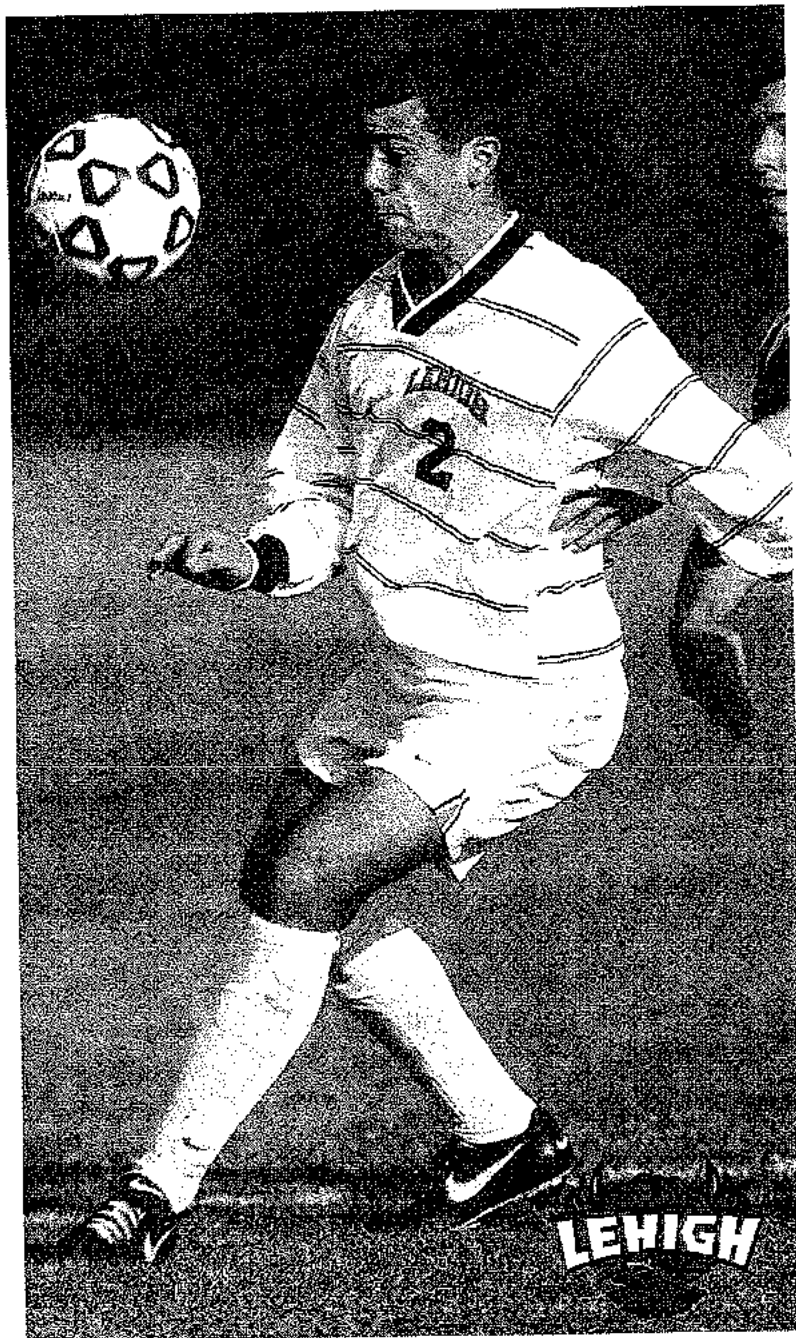

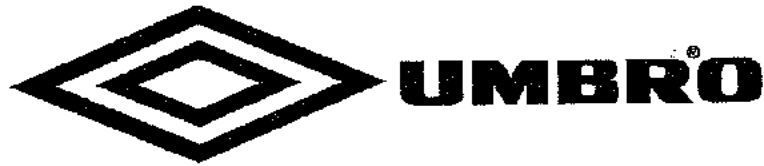

**NATION'S TOP GRADUATING SENIORS, MANY OF THEM ALL-AMERICANS,  
TO COMPETE FEB. 5-6 AT UMBRO SELECT COLLEGE ALL-STAR CLASSIC**

championship, will play for the Elite 16 Women. Tawni Epperson, NSCAA Player of the Year for Macalester College in Division III, will also play for the Elite 16 women.

Twelve All-Americans were named to the Elite 16 Men's Team that will take on the A-League / USISL Select: Darren Warham, Lynn University (Fla.), Tony Soto, Southern Methodist; Stefani Miglioranza, St. John's; Jamie Clark, Stanford; Bueso, Lindsey Wilson; Stephan Danbusky, Williams College; Maurizio Rocha, Connecticut; Lazo Alavanja, Indiana; Simon Elliot, Stanford; Jay Heaps, Duke; Richard Mulrooney, Creighton and Siggí Eyjolfsson, North Carolina-Greensboro.

Seven All-Americans were named to the Elite 16 Women's Team that will play the W-League Select: Michelle French, University of Portland; Carnie Landeen, University of Mobile; Erin Baxter, Florida; Epperson, Macalester College; Pauliina Miettinen, Franklin Pierce; Fotopoulos, Florida; and Tara Koleski, University of Portland.

Top male players competing for the A-League/USISL Select include Lovelace Ackah, D3 Pro League defender of the year with the Chicago Stingers; Mike Burke, A-League rookie of the year with the Charleston Battery (16 goals, 2 assists in 27 games); Mike Butler, D3 Pro League rookie of the year with the Western Mass. Pioneers; and Kirk Wilson of the El Paso Patriots of the A-League (15 goals, 7 assists in 27 games).

Top female players for the W-League Select include leading scorer Charmaine Hooper, W-1 Division most valuable player with the Chicago Cobras; Kim Wyant of the Long Island Lady Riders, W-1 Division goalkeeper of the year; Amy Pseja of the New Jersey Lady Stallions, W-2 Division goalkeeper of the year; Nel Fettig of the Raleigh Wings, W-1 defender of the year; and Ingrid Wagner of the Cleveland Eclipse, W-2 defender of the year.

The preliminary games, scheduled for 6 p.m. each evening, will match the NCAA Division I Women against the Division II, III, NAIA Women on Friday, while Saturday's first game will be the NCAA Division I Men competing against the Division II, III, NAIA Men.

Selection of players was coordinated by a special panel of coaches under the direction of Bob Gray, head coach at Marshall University, who oversees the player selection process. Players are nominated by their respective schools and submitted to the panel for consideration.

### **A Look Back at the 1998 Umbro Select College All-Star Classic**

Two collegiate seniors from the state of Florida had standout performances in the men's feature game at last year's Umbro Select. The Elite 16 College All-Stars pulled an upset by defeating their professional "big brothers" from the USISL, 2-0.

Tyrone Marshall of Florida International University, who was selected the game's most valuable player, scored a brilliant goal from just inside the penalty area in the 23rd minute to give the Elite 16 squad the 1-0 advantage. Forward Jeff Cunningham (South Florida) added the clincher when he worked a give-and-go with Jason Cairns (College of New Jersey) to make it 2-0 in the 63rd minute.

In the first match of the evening, the Division II, III and NAIA Men pulled off a 2-1 upset over the Division I Men's All-Stars. Most Valuable Player Itai Mor (Southern Connecticut State) scored the first goal off an assist from Joe Munoz (Cal State-Bakersfield) in the 23rd minute. Forward Henrik Nebrelius (Tampa) scored in the 79th minute, beating the goalkeeper with some nifty dribbling to make it 2-0. The Division I team's only score was an own goal from a free kick that deflected into the net.

The feature women's game was a see-saw battle between the Women's Elite 16 and the W-League Select ending in a 1-1 draw. MVP Kari Uppinghouse (Nebraska), got things started early when she rocketed a shot into the net from 25 yards out in the 66th minute. The W-League came back when player-coach Michelle Akers (Tampa Bay Extreme) converted a penalty kick.

In the other women's game, the Division I All-Stars, led by midfielder and MVP Ann Cook (College of William & Mary), scored in the first 16 minutes en route to a 4-0 shutout of the Division II-III- NAIA All-Stars. Cook scored the first goal when, in the 12th minute, she chipped the goalkeeper into an empty net off a pass from Lisa Kryzkowski (Wisconsin-Milwaukee). Midfielder Ashley Albrecht (Santa Clara) followed with an unassisted goal just four minutes later. The Division I stars added two more goals in the second half by Laurie Hegedorn (New Mexico) and Kryzkowski.

In the 1996 Division I All-Star game, MVP **Matt McKeon** (St. Louis) scored two goals and added an assist in the West's convincing 4-1 win over the East. He has since become an established professional in Major League Soccer ... **Shannon MacMillan** played in the Umbro Select in 1996. Scoring an incredible 87 goals and added 45 assists during her collegiate playing days at the University of Portland, she went on to be part of the U.S. Women's National Team which won the gold medal in the 1996 Olympics. She continues to be a key player for the USA ... **Steve Ralston** (Florida International) also made a big impact at the 1996 Umbro Select event. The scorer of 40 goals (33 assists) in his collegiate career, Ralston went on to play professionally with the Tampa Bay Mutiny of Major League Soccer, and has received several looks from the U.S. National Team ...
